

#### **Beware of Bears!**

As it gets colder, bears tend to come out seeking food to prepare for winter. Asian black bears (tsukinowaguma) can weigh up to 80kg, have a keen sense of smell, and can run and climb trees very quickly. See the tips below to limit encounters:



#### AT HOME:

Avoid leaving out food scraps which might lure bears - they will come back for more!

- Properly wrap up garbage
- Avoid leaving out pet food
- Keep an eye out for fallen persimmons or chestnuts

#### **OUTSIDE:**

- Avoid dark/wooded areas in the early morning or at night
- Keep a bell or whistle on hand to make your presence known

#### If I encounter a bear, what should I do?

- Do NOT turn away from the bear! Instead, back up slowly
- Once you are safe, notify the police or the Nikko City Environment and Forestry division

When online shopping, you may see special promotions promising low prices. Stop trouble before it starts and prevent any unwanted or unexpected payments.

★Carefully read the full offer – including the fine print! Full subscriptions tend to start with a trial period!

★Review cancellation policies *before* purchase.

Confusing cancellation procedures, unreliable phone lines, etc. are common tactics to prevent customers from leaving!

★Refusing delivery ≠ cancellation of a subscription!

You are still ultimately responsible for any payments if you do not cancel your subscription or contract directly!

★After purchase, print the final confirmation screen for your records. It may be useful later if you need to cancel or contest a purchase!
