Preparing for Tsuyu (Rainy Season)

WHAT IS TSUYU?

In Japan, it rains heavily and often for about a month and a half every year. This period is called *tsuyu* (梅雨), the rainy season. In Nikko, *tsuyu* usually begins around early to mid-June.



WHAT SHOULD I DO?

Keep an umbrella, rain boots, and rain jacket on hand. Wear light clothing that is comfortable in high humidity and dries easily. Humidity and air pressure changes can be tough on the body. To prevent colds or other illnesses, make sure to drink plenty of water, eat well, and get enough sleep.



FLOODING & LANDSLIDES

Natural disasters (especially flooding and landslides) become more likely during the rainy season. If you live in a low-lying area and a flood is likely to occur, please evacuate to a higher area. A Teru-Teru Bōzu is a small doll made from tissue paper, string, and cotton. If you hang one up on the window, they are said to bring clear weather the next day. There is also a nursery rhyme about them!
