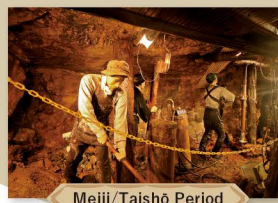
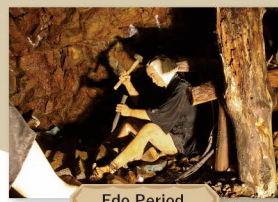

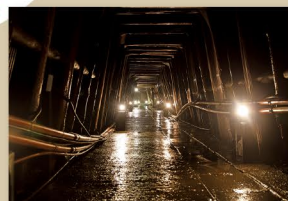

Underground Mine Exhibition The total length of the tunnels mined over approximately 400 years is 1,234 kilometers (approximately the distance between Tokyo and Hakata). This tunnel is the largest underground mine tour in Japan, recreating the Ashio Copper Mine, called "Japan's No.1 mining city". The conditions from hand-dug during the Edo period to mechanized mines are displayed in a familiar way, interweaving conversations from work at that time. You can learn about the history and contents of the mine.

Copper Resource Museum

In the museum inside the mine, there are displays of excavated ores and models recreating the conditions of the refining factories of the time. You can see the trollies that were used up close.

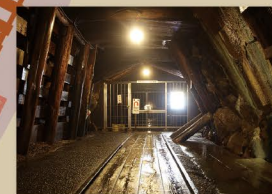

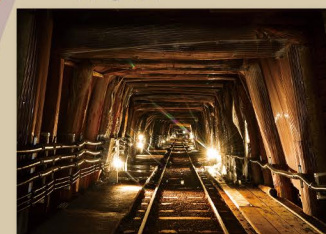

Chusenza (Casting Coin Workshop)

The Kanei Tsuho (One Mon Coin) was a currency produced in various places until the end of the Edo period. Among them, the ones made in Ashio had the character "foot" engraved on the back, hence they were called "Ashi Ji Sen". This facility reproduces the process of making this "Ashi Ji Sen" with a diorama.
